Now What?

Before

Before anything you will meet with the parish Marriage Prep Coordinator to review the process and get a few tips on how to be a mentor. This is basically a coaching session. The engaged couple will also attend. You will have plenty of opportunities for questions.

During

Meet with the Engaged Couple Six Times

At these meetings, before the wedding, you will discuss the questions and activities in the workbook that will be given to you by the parish Marriage Prep Coordinator. One of the six meetings includes having the engaged couple and your priest over for dinner so that the engaged couple can share with you and your priest what they learned about the Theology of Marriage at a local retreat.

- **Attend Sunday Mass Twice a Month Together**
- **Make One Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration Together**
- **Go on One (or More!) Fun Double Date**
- **Pray for the Couple Daily**

After

Every Other Month After Marriage Begins

Because it's called "Marriage Preparation" and not "Wedding Preparation". Continue reaching out to your couple as they begin married life together! Consider inviting them to small groups or retreats within your parish. Always let them know they are welcome to attend Mass with you and let them know that you are there for them!
